Meditation

Jesus Christ explains how the resurrection is a mysterious certainty in three of the Gospels, and in the Good News according to John—immediately before raising Lazarus from the dead—Jesus reveals himself to Martha as the resurrection and the life. Yet, throughout the history of Christ's church, individuals have tried to make the Christian faith more assessable or palatable by denying the resurrection of Jesus Christ—in one way or another. Thanks be to God that 1 Corinthians 15:12-19 and His Holy Spirit help us soberly and somberly consider how utterly hopeless, worthless and miserable our faith would be if Christ had not risen from the dead—as some within Paul's original audience and our communities may suggest.

Readings to help you prepare to worship, as Jesus said, "in spirit and in truth."

Scripture Reading

There came to him some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother. Now there were seven brothers. The first took a wife, and died without children. And the second and the third took her, and likewise all seven left no children and died. Afterward the woman also died. In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had her as wife."

And Jesus said to them, "The sons of this age marry and are given in marriage, but those who are considered worthy to attain to that age and to the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage, for they cannot die anymore, because they are equal to angels and are sons of God, being sons of the resurrection. But that the dead are raised, even Moses showed, in the passage about the bush, where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham and the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for all live to him." Then some of the scribes answered, "Teacher, you have spoken well." For they no longer dared to ask him any question.

Invitation to the Lord's Supper

Words of Institution

The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "This is my body which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Leader: Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of our faith: People: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.
